Short Films (Saturday, 12 pm)



- **Bagheera** (India/UK, Christopher R. Watson) Bagheera is the determined young leader of an Indian Girl Scout troop. Little does she know that she is about to be pushed to her limits, in a fight for her life.
- Cocoons of Outer Space (Brazil, Joel Caetano) She just wanted to relax. But something coming from far away destroys her plans.
- **Finally Alone** (Sweden, Carl Sundström) A man moves away from his house, where an unsettling feeling has been following him.
- **Hear Hear** (Ireland, Emmet O'Brien) A woman is startled to hear a voice from upstairs when she expected to be alone.
- **Her Lips are Mine** (USA, Ken Cohen) Sandy thought escaping deformed from her captor was bad enough, but she realizes that her nightmare is just beginning.
- **Lion** (UK, Davide Melini) An isolated chalet in a snowy forest... A man blinded by alcohol... A woman unable to rebel... And an 8-year-old child troubled and dark... the start of a terrible nightmare.
- **Possessed** (UK, Oliver Jackson) Another usual job for the local exorcist: one possessed daughter, a worried mother and all the might of the Christian faith.
- **Stay Quiet** (USA, Chloe Carroll) It's a natural reaction to scream when you are terrified for your life. But what if that reaction could cost your life?


pies in the local bakery with blood taken from a rabid dog, just before the pies are sold to


